## Docent Training 2012

**What do Wildflower Walk docents do?** We lead 3-hour hikes on weekend mornings from mid-March through mid-June, pointing out wildflowers and plant communities as we hike. We find it a very enjoyable and rewarding experience.

**What will we teach?** The Wednesday evening classes cover the history, topography, geology, and plant communities of Edgewood as well as how to lead a hike. Each evening class is followed by a hike in Edgewood on the next Saturday morning. The same presenter covers the same topic on both days.

**Is there a fee?** Yes, \$25 for training materials, payable the first day of class.

**What is the schedule?** Wednesday evening classes meet from 7 to 9:15 p.m. in Redwood City. Saturday hikes meet at trailheads in Edgewood Park and run from 9:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.

**Are there other time commitments?** We will have a graduation potluck 1 or 2 weeks after the end of the training - date, time and location TBA. In addition, you will be assigned an experienced docent for a "one-on-one" training experience and will also observe or help lead one or two Wildflower Walks during the spring.
